

95 AND STILL HAVE DRIVE -

"95 and Still Have Drive" was the theme of our 95th Anniversary celebration held on September 13th at Willie and Red's famous Smorgasbord. Forty-seven Lions and guests attended the event. PDG Earl Whipple from Connersville presented the Richmond Lions with a congratulatory letter congratulating the Club on 95 years of service to the Community. In part, the letter states: "The Richmond Lions Club has made an immense impact on the community with its many events, fundraisers, and donations. Thank your carrying on the mission of Lions everywhere by helping to make the world a better place." Connersville Lions sponsored the Richmond Lions on October 5, 1924. Lion Ron Smith noted the accomplishments of the Club during their 95-year history. Lions were amazed to hear the Club has raised over \$2,000,000, yes that's six zeros, which has been used to support local, district, state and international projects of Lions. Here are just a few of the projects and expenditures over the 95-year history:

- \$30,000 to the Wayne County Fair when Kuhlman Center was built
- \$30,000 to the Linear Accelerator for IU Medical Center Simon Cancer Center
- \$10,000 to Campaign Site First II to treat River Blindness. Incidentally, Lions may recall this money was raised by having a large jug at meetings, where Lions were encouraged to deposit loose change in the jug
- \$8,000 to the Richmond Parks Department to construct a shelter house as our Lions International Century Legacy Project. The shelter was dedicated as a "Legacy to Lions Past, Present and Future."
- \$8,250.00 for eyeglasses for school age children and adults
- Equipment \$2,000 to Camp Woodsmoke for maintaining

\$4500 for District 25F Vision Screening

- Cabin D sponsored by the Richmond Club as well as installing new lights in the dining room. This is in addition to our annual contributions to
- Lions Projects and Philanthropic Grant program In addition to spending money, Richmond Lions over
